**RUDY GAY #22**

**F 6-8 230 3<sup>RD</sup> NBA SEASON**

*Leads the team in scoring (18.8 points) and steals (1.29) for the second consecutive season...* Runner-up to Orlando's Hedo Turkoglu for the 2007-08 NBA Most Improved Player Award after posting career highs in points (team-high 20.1), rebounds (6.2), assists (2.0), field goal percentage (.462), steals (team-high 1.37), three-point field goals made (134) and minutes (team-high 37.0)... Boasted the highest scoring increase (9.3 ppg) among all qualifying NBA players from the previous season... Ranked first among all NBA sophomores in scoring (20.1 points) in 2007-08... Holds the Memphis record for points in a single season (1,632 in 2007-08)... Just the third player in franchise history to average over 20 points per game (Shareef Abdur-Rahim, Pau Gasol)... 2006-07 All-Rookie NBA First Team... Placed third in NBA Rookie of the Year voting after averaging 10.8 points and 4.5 rebounds in rookie campaign.

**DARRELL ARTHUR #00**

**F 6-9 235 ROOKIE**

*Ranks in the Top 10 among first-year players in rebounds (4.4, 8<sup>th</sup>) and blocks (0.70, 5<sup>th</sup>)... Recorded a double-double (11 points, 15 rebounds) off the bench in NBA debut on Oct. 29 at Houston, setting a franchise record for rebounds in a Grizzlies debut...* In two seasons at Kansas, averaged 11.3 points, 5.5 rebounds and 1.40 blocks on 54.1 percent shooting in 21.9 minutes in 78 games (46 starts)... Scored 20 points (9-of-13 FG) and hauled in 10 rebounds vs. Memphis in the national championship game on April 7.

**MARC GASOL #33**

**C 7-1 280 ROOKIE**

*Shooting .527 from the field and is on pace to break his brother Pau Gasol's franchise rookie record for field goal percentage (.518 in 2001-02)... Ranks in the Top 10 among NBA rookies (same qualifiers as NBA league leaders) in points (11.4, 7<sup>th</sup>), rebounds (team-high 7.5, 3<sup>rd</sup>), blocks (1.09, 2<sup>nd</sup>), field goal percentage (1<sup>st</sup>), steals (0.75, 9<sup>th</sup>) and minutes (30.7, 6<sup>th</sup>)...* Poured in a career-high 30 points and 13 rebounds on March 7 vs. Philadelphia... Recorded 15 points and a game-high eight rebounds in the T-Mobile Rookie Challenge on Feb. 13 as part of All-Star Weekend in Phoenix... Posted 27 points and 16 rebounds in fourth career game on Nov. 3 vs. Golden State... Recorded a double-double (12 points, 12 rebounds) in NBA debut on Oct. 29 at Houston... Captured a silver medal at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China playing for the Spanish National Team alongside Pau Gasol... Won the 2007-08 ACB Most Valuable Player Award after averaging 16.2 points, 8.3 rebounds and 1.8 blocks.

**O. J. MAYO #32**

**G 6-4 210 ROOKIE**

*One of the leading candidates for the NBA Rookie of the Year Award... Leads all NBA rookies in scoring (18.4 points)... Ranks in the Top 10 among rookies in assists (3.0, 4<sup>th</sup>), steals (1.10, 3<sup>rd</sup>), three-pointers made (122, 2<sup>nd</sup>), three-point field goal percentage (.387, 6<sup>th</sup>), free throw percentage (.875, 3<sup>rd</sup>) and minutes (team-high 37.9, 1<sup>st</sup>)...* Won the NBA Western Conference Rookie of the Month Award for October/November... Recorded 12 points and a team-high three steals in the T-Mobile Rookie Challenge on Feb. 13 as part of All-Star Weekend in Phoenix... Scored in double-digits in his first 25 career games, the longest such streak by an NBA rookie since David Robinson (77) in 1989-90... Selected with the third overall pick in the 2008 NBA Draft by the Minnesota Timberwolves behind only Rose (No. 1) and Michael Beasley (No. 2) and was traded hours later to the Grizzlies... Named to the 2008 USA Basketball Men's Select Team, chosen to help prepare the 2008 USA Senior National Team for the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China.

**MIKE CONLEY #11**

**G 6-1 185 2<sup>ND</sup> NBA SEASON**

*Leads the team in assists (4.1) and three-point field goal percentage (career-high .389)... Scored a career-high 31 points and made a career-best (and Grizzlies season high) 14 field goals on March 7 vs. Philadelphia... Scored in double figures in a career-high 15 consecutive games from Jan. 28-Mar. 3...* Led 2007-08 NBA rookies with a team-high 4.2 assists, the highest average for a first-year player since the 2005-06 season... Averaged 9.9 points and 4.2 assists in 46 starts last season... Helped lead Ohio State to a 35-4 record and the national championship game in his only season in college.

Celtics 105, Grizzlies 87 | **3/21/09 at FedExForum**

**MEMPHIS, TN** – The Memphis Grizzlies stayed within four points of the defending NBA World Champion Boston Celtics at halftime, but behind a career-high 24 points from reserve forward **Glen Davis**, Boston pulled away in the second half... After **Mike Conley's** lay-up cut Boston's lead to three points (62-59) with 7:18 left in the third quarter, Boston went on a 10-0 run to build the lead up to 13 (72-59) with 3:49 left in the quarter... The Grizzlies, who trailed by as many as 25 points in the fourth quarter, would not cut the lead below double-digits for the rest of the game... The Celtics held Memphis to 29.8 percent shooting (14-of-47 FG) in the second half after the Grizzlies had shot 51.4 percent (19-of-37 FG) in the first half... Boston, which shot 56.2 percent for the game, was aided by 51 points off the bench, as the Celtics won their third consecutive game after losing four of their previous five... **Hakim Warrick** scored 20 points (7-of-15 FG) off the bench to lead the Grizzlies... **Rudy Gay** scored 15 points, and **Greg Buckner** led the team in rebounds (7) and steals (3)... Only five starters total scored in double figures, three for Memphis and two for Boston... The Celtics swept the Grizzlies for the second consecutive season... Before Boston's current run, the Celtics had not swept Memphis since 2000-01, the season before the Grizzlies moved to Bluff City... The game marked the Grizzlies' second sell-out of the season (18,119)... The Grizzlies also sold-out when they hosted the LA Lakers on Jan. 31.

Hornets 96, Grizzlies 84 | **3/20/09 at New Orleans Arena**

**NEW ORLEANS, LA** – The Memphis Grizzlies led by one point at the end of the third quarter, but after committing seven of the team's 20 turnovers in the fourth quarter, could not string together consecutive road wins for the first time this season... With the game tied at 79 with 4:46 left in the game, New Orleans went on a 17-1 run to take a 16-point lead (96-80) and put the game away... Before the Hornets' run, there had been 19 lead changes and 13 ties in the game... **Chris Paul** led the Hornets with 32 points (12-of-18 FG) and nine assists, while **David West** put in 29 points... Paul's 24 second-half points were the most scored in a single half against Memphis this season... Together, Paul and West scored 38 of the Hornets' 55 second-half points, as New Orleans scored 27 points off turnovers... Memphis was led by **Rudy Gay's** 23 points (7-of-14 FG), while **Marc Gasol** and **Hakim Warrick** each scored 12... New Orleans outscored the Grizzlies 58-34 in the paint... Memphis remained winless on the road this season against Southwest Division opponents (0-8).

**SERIES HISTORY:** The Grizzlies beat the Heat in both meetings last season, sweeping the season set for the first time since the 2002-03 season... The Grizzlies swept just two other teams in the 2007-08 season besides the Heat (New York Knicks, New Jersey Nets)... Memphis is 10-15 all-time against Miami, including a 6-7 home record, and has not lost to the Heat since Dec. 16, 2006 (98-90) at Miami.

**NOTABLES:** Heat rookie forward **Michael Beasley** and Grizzlies rookie guard **O.J. Mayo** were selected second and third overall respectively in the 2008 NBA Draft after each had played one collegiate season... Mayo's USC Trojans squared off against Beasley's Kansas State Wildcats in the first round of the 2008 NCAA Tournament, with the Wildcats advancing, 80-67... Grizzlies rookie forward **Darrell Arthur** and Heat rookie guard **Mario Chalmers** eventually won the 2008 NCAA Tournament as members of the Kansas Jayhawks... Grizzlies guard **Mike Conley** and Heat guard **Daequan Cook** were teammates on the Ohio State Buckeyes squad that advanced to the 2007 NCAA Championship Game.

	<p><b>2008-09 SEASON</b></p> <p><b>Grizzlies 102, Heat 86   12/14/08 at FedExForum</b></p> <p><b>MEMPHIS, TN</b> – Memphis extended its winning streak to a season-best four games, defeating Miami in the team's largest margin of victory this season... The Grizzlies, who had not won consecutive games all season prior to the current run, are now on the franchise's longest winning streak since the 2005-06 season (Apr. 11-19, 2006)... With the game tied at 46 at halftime, the Grizzlies started the second half on a 16-6 run to take a 62-52 lead with 8:24 remaining in the third and would close the quarter on a 12-2 run to take an 81-66 lead heading into the fourth... The Grizzlies scored 35 points in the third, the most by the team in any quarter this season, and would outshoot Miami 65.0 percent to 28.0 percent in the frame... <b>O.J. Mayo</b> scored a game-high 28 points (8-of-17 FG), the rookie's highest point total in a win to date, and four other Grizzlies reached double figures... <b>Darko Milicic</b> recorded his second-straight game in double figures with 13 points and a career-high tying five blocks, while <b>Marc Gasol</b> led the team with seven rebounds and tied career highs in blocks (three) and assists (four)... <b>Michael Beasley</b> led the Heat with 20 points (8-of-17 FG), and <b>Joel Anthony</b> recorded his first career double-double with career highs in points (12) and rebounds (13)... <b>Dwyane Wade</b>, who entered the game as the NBA's leading scorer, was held to just 17 points on 5-of-16 FG shooting.</p>

**SERIES HISTORY:** The Grizzlies are 14-39 against the Kings in the all-time series, including a 1-2 mark this season... In the teams' last meeting on Feb. 20, Sacramento won at Memphis despite dressing only eight players due to the Kings' trade deadline moves... Despite a 1-25 road record against Sacramento, Memphis is nearly even vs. the Kings at home (13-14)... The Grizzlies' only win in Sac-town was a 112-108 overtime victory on April 19, 1998, when the team was located in Vancouver... Since then, the Kings have defended their home floor 20-straight times vs. the Grizzlies.

**NOTABLES:** Grizzlies rookie forward **Darrell Arthur** and Kings rookie forward **Donte' Greene** were traded for each other on draft night last June... Memphis originally selected Greene 28<sup>th</sup> overall in the first round and then traded his rights to the Houston Rockets in exchange to the rights to Arthur... Greene was later traded to Sacramento on Aug. 14, 2008... Greene and Grizzlies forward **Hakim Warrick** both attended Syracuse University... Kings Assistant Coach **Shareef Abdur-Rahim** played five seasons (1996-2001) for the Vancouver Grizzlies, averaging 20.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 2.9 assists in 375 games (366 starts) before a draft-day trade in 2001 sent him to Atlanta in exchange for **Pau Gasol**, **Lorenzen Wright** and **Brevin Knight**... Abdur-Rahim ranks second in Grizzlies franchise history in both points and rebounds (behind Gasol)... Kings guard **Bobby Jackson** spent one season (2005-06) in Memphis, averaging 11.4 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.7 assists in 25.0 minutes 71 games (15 starts)... Kings Assistant Coach **Jason Hamm** worked as an assistant coach for the Grizzlies during the 2004-05 season... Grizzlies radio play-by-play announcer **Eric Hasseltine** worked for the flagship station of the Sacramento Kings as a reporter and host of a weekly NBA show before coming to Memphis.

Mayo</b> recorded a career-high 28 points (10-of-19 FG), including six three-pointers, while <b>Kyle Lowry</b> set season highs with 14 points, six rebounds and seven assists... <b>Rudy Gay</b> chipped in with 18 points on 5-of-12 shooting... Sacramento's 10-point advantage (95-85, 3:10 left in the fourth quarter) dwindled to four (95-91) with 53.5 seconds left, but a <b>John Salmons</b> dunk and two <b>Kevin Martin</b> free throws gave the Kings a 99-91 lead with 22.6 seconds left... Martin led all scorers with a season-high 33 points (11-of-18 FG), tying the record for most points scored by a King in a home opener (<b>Reggie Theus</b>, 1986 vs. LA Clippers)... The last time the Grizzlies won a contest against the Kings at ARCO Arena was on 4/19/98 (112-108 in OT)... The club's 20-game losing streak at Sacramento matches the longest active road losing streak against a team behind Golden State at San Antonio and Milwaukee at Phoenix, both at 20... The Grizzlies are winless in 14 tries in Sacramento since moving to Memphis.</p> <p><b>Grizzlies 109, Kings 94   11/18/08 at FedExForum</b></p> <p><b>MEMPHIS, TN</b> – The Memphis Grizzlies snapped a four-game losing streak in decisive fashion, defeating the Sacramento Kings in team's most-lopsided win this season... The Grizzlies shot a season-high .542 from the field, the first time this season the team has shot over 50 percent, and made 10 three-pointers (in 16 attempts)... With Memphis leading 37-35 with 9:55 remaining in the second quarter, the Grizzlies strung together runs of 8-0 and 10-1 to take a 17-point halftime lead (64-47)... Memphis would take a 23-point advantage (100-77) with 6:34 left in the fourth quarter, the club's largest lead in any game this season... ## JUST THE QUICK FACTS

- The Memphis Grizzlies have possibly the toughest remaining schedule in the NBA, playing **nine** games against teams with winning records (the **highest** number in the NBA) and just **four** games against teams below .500 (the second-lowest number in the league)... **Seven** of Memphis' final **13** games will come on the road, including each of the next **four**.
- Memphis is shooting for its first season series sweep of the season and its second consecutive season series sweep of the Heat... Before the 2007-08 season, the Grizzlies had swept Miami just once in franchise history (2002-03)... The Grizzlies swept just three teams last season (Miami, New York, New Jersey).
- Since **Lionel Hollins** was hired as head coach on Jan. 25, five different Grizzlies (**O.J. Mayo**, **Rudy Gay**, **Marc Gasol**, **Hakim Warrick** and **Mike Conley**) have scored 30-plus points in a game, with all of those players besides Gay either setting or tying career highs in points... Before the Hollins hire, only Mayo had scored 30 or more points in a single game this season.
- The Grizzlies are one of just three NBA teams to have five or more players on their roster score 30-plus points in a game this season (New York – 6, Phoenix – 5).
- Marc Gasol** is making a case for the NBA Western Conference Rookie of the Month Award for March... Gasol is averaging **14.4** points, **8.3** rebounds, **3.1** assists and **1.5** blocks on **54.8** percent shooting in **11** games this month, with **four** double-doubles and **two** 20-10 games (one point/rebound, one point/assist).
- Memphis is **6-20** since **Lionel Hollins** took over as head coach of the team on Jan. 25.
- Memphis is **2-2** this season in games decided by three points or less... Last season, the club finished a league-worst 2-11 in games decided by that margin.
- Memphis is **1-23** this season when failing to reach 20 points in the first quarter (**16-29** when scoring 20 or more).
- Memphis stands at **14-16** this season when shooting over 46.0 percent from the field and **3-34** when shooting under that clip.
- The Grizzlies are **14-20** this season when outscoring or tying opponents the third quarter and **3-32** when they don't.
- O.J. Mayo** scored a career-high tying 33 points on Feb. 2 at Washington and followed up with 32 points on Feb. 4 vs. Houston... Mayo has made a habit of pairing his 30-point games this season... The Rookie of the Year candidate has gone over 30 a total of **six** times this season – in three two-game sets.
- O.J. Mayo** has made **122** of the Grizzlies' **321** three-pointers, **38.0** percent of the team's makes this season, which is the highest percentage in the NBA.
- Mike Conley** is averaging **14.0** points, **3.7** rebounds and **5.8** assists in **26** games since **Lionel Hollins** was named head coach on Jan. 25.
- Marc Gasol** is shooting **.527** from the field, leading all NBA rookies, and is on pace to break his brother **Pau Gasol's** franchise rookie record (.518 in 2001-02)... Gasol is shooting **58.2** percent (**64-of-110** FG) in the fourth quarter and overtime this season.
- Memphis has used a three-rookie starting lineup (**O.J. Mayo**, **Marc Gasol** and **Darrell Arthur**) in **44** games this season.... Before this season, the Grizzlies had started a rookie trio in just four games total since moving from Vancouver to Memphis in 2001, with all four of those games coming in the 2001-02 season (**Pau Gasol**, **Shane Battier** and **Will Solomon**).
- Marc Gasol** scored a career-high 30 points and guard **Mike Conley** added a career-high 31 in Memphis' 110-105 home loss to Philadelphia on March 7... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it's the first time in franchise history that the Grizzlies have gotten 30 points from both their starting center and from a starting guard. Only one other NBA center/guard combo has pulled this trick this season... Marc's brother **Pau Gasol** and **Kobe Bryant** have done it three times for the Lakers.
- Mike Conley** (31 points, nine assists) and **Marc Gasol** (30 points, 13 rebounds) became the first Grizzlies duo since **Rudy Gay** and **Mike Miller** on Dec. 3, 2007 vs. Portland to each record 30-plus points in a game... Gasol also became just the seventh player in Memphis franchise history to post a 30-10 game, a list that includes his brother **Pau Gasol**.
- Seven of the 14 players on the Grizzlies' roster were 23 years old or younger at the start of the season.

As part of the USC product's Rookie of the Year campaign, the Memphis Grizzlies unveiled three different Mayo billboards in Phoenix during All-Star Weekend, where the explosive scorer participated in the Rookie Challenge as well as the GEICO H-O-R-S-E competition... In conjunction with the campaign, the Grizzlies have also launched [voteoj.com](http://voteoj.com), a Web site that includes Mayo's statistical accomplishments this season as well as testimonials from players, coaches and media members.

### CONLEY IMPROVING

Second-year guard **Mike Conley** has picked up his overall game since **Lionel Hollins** took over as head coach... The 21-year-old exploded for a career-high 31 points and nine assists on March 7 vs. Philadelphia... Conley averaged 14.5 points, 4.8 rebounds and 6.2 assists in the month of February (12 games) and scored in double figures in a career-high 15 consecutive games from Jan. 28-Mar. 3... The streak was halted when Conley fractured a tooth after playing two minutes on Mar. 4 at LA Clippers and did not return... The second-year point guard posted double-doubles in consecutive games from Feb. 18-20 after doubling up just twice in his first 106 career games.

## NO ORDINARY ROOKIE

**O.J. Mayo** had his string of 25 consecutive games in double figures to start his NBA career snapped on Dec. 19 vs. Charlotte, but the streak had been one of the longest the league has seen in recent years... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Mayo was one of just six players since the 1979-80 season to start his NBA career with 25-plus games of 10-plus points, ahead of NBA greats such as **Magic Johnson** and **Larry Bird**... It marked the NBA's longest career-starting streak since **David Robinson** started his career with 77-straight double-digit games for the San Antonio Spurs in the 1989-90 season... Mayo was the final rookie this season to score in single digits... Here is a look at such streaks in the last 30 years:

## BACK TO THE FUTURE

Memphis' major infusion of young talent is reflected in this season's regular starting lineup, which includes rookies **O.J. Mayo**, **Marc Gasol** and **Darrell Arthur**... Memphis has started three rookies in a game 44 times this season... The Grizzlies sparingly started a rookie trio in the 2001-02 season, the club's first in Memphis, with **Pau Gasol** (79 starts), **Shane Battier** (78 starts) and **Will Solomon** (four starts)... After that trio's final start on April 6, 2002, the Grizzlies did not start three rookies in a game until Mayo, Arthur and Marc Gasol started in the 2008-09 home opener on Oct. 31 vs. Orlando... The team fought back from a 15-point deficit and earned the first home opener win in Memphis' eight-year history, on a buzzer-beating 18-footer by **Rudy Gay**... Here is a look at the 2008-09 Grizzlies matched with the last four NBA teams that regularly went with a three-rookie starting lineup:

Memphis finished 4-8 in the month of February after going 1-13 in the previous month... With double-digit victories on Feb. 2 at Washington and on Feb. 4 vs. Houston, Memphis picked up consecutive double-digit wins for the first time since winning the final three games of the 2006-07 season (April 14-18, 2007) when current head coach **Lionel Hollins** was serving as an assistant for the team... ## THE FUTURE IS NOW

The Grizzlies boast one of the largest collections of young talent in the NBA, carrying **seven** players who were 23 years old or younger at the start of the season on the roster and four rookies (**O.J. Mayo**, **Darrell Arthur**, **Marc Gasol** and **Hamed Haddadi**)... In **37** games this season, Memphis started **Rudy Gay** (22 years old), **O.J. Mayo** (21), **Marc Gasol** (23\*\*), **Darrell Arthur** (20) and **Mike Conley** (21), a starting unit with an average age at the start of the season of **21.4** years old... By comparison, the 2007-08 University of Memphis Tigers, who made it to the NCAA Championship Game last season, had a starting five whose average age was 21.6 years old! Here is chart comparing the Grizzlies' 2008-09 most prolific starting lineup with the Tigers' starting lineup from last season:

## TWO SIDES OF THE (FIRST) QUARTER

Getting off to a good start has been an important part of Memphis' success this season... In their **17** wins, the Grizzlies average **26.9** points in the first quarter as opposed to just **21.8** first-quarter points in their **52** losses... Memphis is **1-23** this season when it fails to reach 20 points in the opening frame (**16-29** when scoring 20-or-more)... The Grizzlies have been outscored by a total of **199** points in the first quarter this season.

## TWO SIDES OF THE (THIRD) QUARTER

The third quarter has been crucial in the Grizzlies' games this season... Memphis is **14-20** when outscoring or tying opponents in the third and **3-32** when it doesn't... The club is **13-8** this season when leading after three quarters and **3-44** when tied or trailing after the third... Here is a breakdown of the Grizzlies' scoring matched with their opponents' by quarter this season:

The Grizzlies allowed a franchise-record low 29.5 field goal percentage to the New Orleans Hornets on Feb. 9, one game after the team held the Toronto Raptors to a season-low 29.5 percent from the field... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Memphis is the first team in nearly 50 years to hold consecutive opponents under 30.0 percent shooting, the first since the St. Louis Hawks in 1959 held the Philadelphia Warriors (Dec. 19) and Detroit Pistons (Dec. 20) below that number... ### Biography

On Jan. 25, 2009, Memphis Grizzlies General Manager and Basketball Operations **Chris Wallace** named **Lionel Hollins** the Grizzlies' 11<sup>th</sup> head coach in team history.

For Hollins, it marks his third head coaching stint with the Grizzlies, where he was a staple in the team's coaching ranks from 1995-07. The 20-year NBA coaching veteran has worked with current Grizzlies **Rudy Gay**, **Hakim Warrick** and **Kyle Lowry** as an assistant under former Grizzlies Head Coaches **Mike Fratello** and **Tony Barone**. Hollins, who still maintains a residence in Bluff City with his family, recently spent the first half of the 2008-09 season as an assistant under **Scott Skiles** with the Milwaukee Bucks.

An original member of the franchise's inaugural 1995-96 season in Vancouver as the lead assistant, Hollins served as the club's head coach on an interim basis on two separate occasions. Hollins guided Vancouver to an 18-42 finish in 1999-00 (.300) after the team started the season 4-18 and again took the reins for four games in 2004-05 following the resignation of **Hubie Brown**. Hollins, 55, owns an all-time record of 18-46 (.281) as the Grizzlies' interim head coach.

Prior to joining the Grizzlies, the Arizona State graduate spent seven years with the Phoenix Suns (1988-95) as an assistant coach under **Cotton Fitzsimmons** and later **Paul Westphal**. During that time, Phoenix compiled an overall record of 394-180 (.686) and never won fewer than 53 games in a single season. The Suns won franchise-record 62 games in the 1992-93 season and represented the Western Conference in the 1993 NBA Finals against the Chicago Bulls.

The Arkansas City, Kansas native has served under three NBA Coaches of the Year, including Brown (1977, 2005), Fitzsimmons (1978, 1989) and Fratello (1986) and was on the coaching staff when Brown and Fitzsimmons were honored with the award a second time. In addition, as a 10-year NBA veteran (1975-85), Hollins was led by several notable head coaches, including **Lenny Wilkens**, **Jack Ramsay**, **Billy Cunningham**, **Bill Fitch**, **Chuck Daly** and **Paul Silas**.

Selected sixth overall in the first round of the 1975 NBA Draft by the Portland Trail Blazers, Hollins earned a spot on the 1976 All-Rookie First Team and won an NBA Championship as a starter for the Trail Blazers in 1977, where he was a teammate of current Grizzlies Assistant Coach **Johnny Davis**. A year later, he was an NBA All-Star while also being named to the NBA's All-Defensive First Team. Hollins averaged 11.6 points, 4.5 assists and 1.56 steals over 673 career games with Portland, Philadelphia 76ers, San Diego Clippers, Detroit Pistons and Houston Rockets.
