RUDY GAY #22

F 6-8 230 3RD NBA SEASON

Leads the team in scoring (18.9 points) and steals (1.27) for the second consecutive season... Scored a Grizzlies season-high 35 points on March 4 at LA Clippers... Runner-up to Orlando's Hedo Turkoglu for the 2007-08 NBA Most Improved Player Award after posting career highs in points (team-high 20.1), rebounds (6.2), assists (2.0), field goal percentage (.462), steals (team-high 1.37), three-point field goals made (134) and minutes (team-high 37.0)... Boasted the highest scoring increase (9.3 ppg) among all qualifying NBA players from the previous season... Ranked first among all NBA sophomores in scoring (20.1 points) in 2007-08... Holds the Memphis record for points in a single season (1,632 in 2007-08)... Just the third player in franchise history to average over 20 points per game (Shareef Abdur-Rahim, Pau Gasol)... 2006-07 All-Rookie NBA First Team... Placed third in NBA Rookie of the Year voting after averaging 10.8 points and 4.5 rebounds in rookie campaign.

DARRELL ARTHUR #00

F 6-9 235 ROOKIE

Ranks in the Top 10 among first-year players in rebounds (4.4, 8th) and blocks (0.69, 5th)... Recorded a double-double (11 points, 15 rebounds) off the bench in NBA debut on Oct. 29 at Houston, setting a franchise record for rebounds in a Grizzlies debut... In two seasons at Kansas, averaged 11.3 points, 5.5 rebounds and 1.40 blocks on 54.1 percent shooting in 21.9 minutes in 78 games (46 starts)... Scored 20 points (9-of-13 FG) and hauled in 10 rebounds vs. Memphis in the national championship game on April 7.

MARC GASOL #33

C 7-1 280 ROOKIE

Shooting .533 from the field and is on pace to break his brother Pau Gasol's franchise rookie record for field goal percentage (.518 in 2001-02)... Has the highest field goal percentage for a qualifying NBA rookie since Andrew Bogut (.533 in 2005-06)... Ranks in the Top 10 among NBA rookies (same qualifiers as NBA league leaders) in points (11.8, 7th), rebounds (team-high 7.4, 3rd), blocks (1.08, 2nd), field goal percentage (1st), steals (0.78, 9th) and minutes (30.8, 6th)... Poured in a career-high 30 points and 13 rebounds on March 7 vs. Philadelphia... Recorded 15 points and a game-high eight rebounds in the T-Mobile Rookie Challenge on Feb. 13 as part of All-Star Weekend in Phoenix... Recorded a double-double (12 points, 12 rebounds) in NBA debut on Oct. 29 at Houston... Captured a silver medal at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China playing for the Spanish National Team alongside Pau Gasol... Won the 2007-08 ACB Most Valuable Player Award after averaging 16.2 points, 8.3 rebounds and 1.8 blocks.

O. J. MAYO #32

G 6-4 210 ROOKIE

One of the leading candidates for the NBA Rookie of the Year Award... Leads all NBA rookies in scoring (18.4 points)... Ranks in the Top 10 among rookies in assists (3.2, 4th), steals (1.12, 3rd), three-pointers made (134, 2nd), three-point field goal percentage (.384, 6th), free throw percentage (.875, 3rd) and minutes (team-high 38.0, 1st)... Won the NBA Western Conference Rookie of the Month Award for October/November... Recorded 12 points and a team-high three steals in the T-Mobile Rookie Challenge on Feb. 13 as part of All-Star Weekend in Phoenix... Scored in double-digits in his first 25 career games, the longest such streak by an NBA rookie since David Robinson (77) in 1989-90... Selected with the third overall pick in the 2008 NBA Draft by the Minnesota Timberwolves behind only Rose (No. 1) and Michael Beasley (No. 2) and was traded hours later to the Grizzlies... Named to the 2008 USA Basketball Men's Select Team, chosen to help prepare the 2008 USA Senior National Team for the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China.

MIKE CONLEY #11

G 6-1 185 2ND NBA SEASON

Leads the team in assists (career-high 4.3) and three-point field goal percentage (career-high .418)... Scored a career-high 31 points and made a career-best (and Grizzlies season high) 14 field goals on March 7 vs. Philadelphia... Scored in double figures in a career-high 15 consecutive games from Jan. 28-Mar. 3... Led 2007-08 NBA rookies with a team-high 4.2 assists, the highest average for a first-year player since the 2005-06 season... Averaged 9.9 points and 4.2 assists in 46 starts last season... Helped lead Ohio State to a 35-4 record and the national championship game in his only season in college.

Trail Blazers 96, Grizzlies 93 | 4/7/09 at FedExForum

MEMPHIS, TN – A late rally by the Trail Blazers snapped the Grizzlies' season-high tying four-game winning streak and sent Memphis to just its second loss in the last seven games... Memphis had a five-point lead (91-86) with 2:51 left in the fourth quarter, but Portland ended the game on a 10-2 run... **Brandon Roy** scored 11 of his team-high 24 points (7-of-16 FG) in the final four-and-a-half minutes of the game, while **Travis Outlaw** hit the go-ahead shot with 13.3 seconds on the clock... **O.J. Mayo** led all scorers with 31 points (13-of-21 FG), his highest total since scoring 32 points on Feb. 4 vs. Houston... Mayo's performance, his seventh this season with 30-plus points, included five three-pointers, his most since hitting five from downtown on Jan. 4 vs. Dallas... **Rudy Gay** added 19 points (8-of-12 FG)... The Grizzlies lost their seventh-straight game to the Trail Blazers and remained winless at home this season against Northwest Division opponents (0-9)... The Grizzlies tied a season-low with just 23 rebounds compared to 38 boards for the Trail Blazers... Memphis blew an 18-point second quarter lead (47-29), the team's largest blown lead this season... Portland shot 65.7 percent in the second half after shooting 33.3 percent in the first.

MILWAUKEE, WI – The Grizzlies extended their winning streak to four games, tying the club's longest streak of the season, on the strength of a big second quarter in Milwaukee... Memphis scored a season-high 38 points in the second quarter, matching the Bucks' first half total... The Grizzlies outscored Milwaukee by 20 points in the second quarter, 38-18, including a 22-8 run to start the period... **Rudy Gay** led all scorers with 26 points (10-of-17 FG), his fourth consecutive game with 20-plus points... **Mike Conley** had 17 points (6-of-11 FG), including a career-high tying four three-pointers for the third consecutive game... **Marc Gasol** added 19 points (4-of-10 FG) and 10 rebounds for his 17th double-double of the season... Milwaukee was led by **Richard Jefferson's** 24, while **Charlie Bell** tied a season-high with five three-pointers to go with 23 points and a season-best eight rebounds... **Ramon Sessions** finished with 16 points (7-of-11 FG) and 11 assists... Memphis won at the Bradley Center for the first time since April 1, 2005 and swept a back-to-back set for the first time since March 21-22, 2008.

SERIES HISTORY: Memphis defeated Orlando in the Grizzlies' home opener on Oct. 31 on a buzzer-beating 18-footer from **Rudy Gay**... It marked the club's first win in a home opener since moving to Memphis in 2001... The Grizzlies split the 2007-08 regular season series with the Magic, with each team winning on the road... On Jan. 23, 2008, Orlando tied a Grizzlies opponent's franchise record by making 18 three-pointers in a 112-85 victory at FedExForum... Orlando defeated Memphis, 101-90, on Oct. 22, 2008 at Amway Arena in the Grizzlies' final preseason game.

NOTABLES: In the voting for the 2008 NBA Most Improved Player Award, Grizzlies forward **Rudy Gay** finished second only to Magic forward **Hedo Turkoglu**... Grizzlies forward/center **Darko Milicic** played one-and-a-half seasons with the Magic after he was acquired from Detroit along with **Carlos Arroyo** in exchange for **Kelvin Cato** and a future protected first round draft pick on Feb. 15, 2006... Grizzlies Assistant Coach **Johnny Davis** succeeded **Doc Rivers** and served as the head coach of the Orlando Magic for parts of two seasons (2003-05), where he went 51-84 (.378)... Magic center **Adonal Foyle** was traded to the Grizzlies on Feb. 19 in a three-way trade that sent **Kyle Lowry** to the Houston Rockets... Foyle played in one game for Memphis before agreeing to a buyout and returning to Orlando... Magic forward **Jeremy Richardson** played three games last season for Memphis, recording one rebound and one assist in a total of 15 minutes... Grizzlies guard **Mike Wilks** also was traded from Orlando to Memphis in that three-team trade... Wilks signed a free-agent contract with Orlando on Sept. 25, 2008 but suffered a season-ending knee injury in the preseason and has not played in a game this season.

	2008-09 SEASON Grizzlies 86, Magic 84 10/31/08 at FedExForum MEMPHIS, TN – A buzzer-beating 18-footer from Rudy Gay gave the Memphis Grizzlies their first win in a home opener in eight years... It marked the second career game-winning basket for Gay, who led all scorers with 29 points (11-of-26 FG), including 14 in the final quarter... Memphis previously had lost all seven of its home openers (which were all also season openers) since moving to the Bluff City in 2001... O.J. Mayo added 17 points (5-of-11 FG) while Darrell Arthur had another double-digit rebound game with 10 in his first career start... Memphis started three rookies (Mayo, Arthur, Marc Gasol) for the first time since April 6, 2002 at Washington (Pau Gasol, Shane Battier, Will Solomon) and despite the starting unit's average age (21.2 years old), the team rallied back from a 15-point third-quarter deficit, holding Orlando to just 25.0 percent shooting (9-of-36 FG) in the second half... The club's largest comeback in 2007-08 was 14 points (twice)... After the teams had traded the lead several times in the fourth quarter, a pair of free throws from Hakim Warrick tied the game at 84 with 1:08 remaining... Orlando had its final chance, inbounding the ball with 2.8 seconds left, but Hedo Turkoglu's pass was intercepted by Kyle Lowry , setting up Rudy's game-winner... Rashard Lewis led Orlando with 23 points (8-of-18 FG) while Dwight Howard recorded his second double-double in as many games with 14 points (5-of-9 FG) and 14 rebounds.

SERIES HISTORY: Phoenix has beaten Memphis 10-straight times dating back to Feb. 8, 2006, averaging 115.8 points per game and crossing 100 points nine times in that span... Prior to the current losing streak, Memphis had won four of the last five in the series... The Grizzlies have not beaten the Suns since Dec. 17, 2005 (91-87) and have not won in Phoenix, where the team is 4-22 all-time, since Nov. 16, 2005 (115-103)... The No. 1-seeded Suns swept Memphis 4-0 in the first round of the 2005 Western Conference Playoffs.

NOTABLES: Grizzlies Head Coach **Lionel Hollins** spent seven years with the Phoenix Suns (1988-95) as an assistant coach under **Cotton Fitzsimmons** and later **Paul Westphal**... During that time, Phoenix compiled an overall record of 394-180 (.686) and never won fewer than 53 games in a single season... The Suns won franchise-record 62 games in the 1992-93 season and represented the Western Conference in the 1993 NBA Finals against the Chicago Bulls... Grizzlies forward **Rudy Gay** scored a career-high 36 points twice vs. Phoenix on Feb. 26, 2008 and April 8, 2008, both at FedExForum... Grizzlies center **Marc Gasol** scored 27 points and grabbed 16 rebounds in his fourth career NBA game on Nov. 3, 2008 vs. Golden State, becoming the first player to record a 25-point, 15-rebound game within the first five games of his NBA career since current Suns center **Shaquille O'Neal** did it on Nov. 12, 1992 vs. Washington as a member of the Orlando Magic... Grizzlies Limited Partner and Radio Color Analyst **Elliot Perry** enjoyed some of his best seasons with the Suns, and was runner-up for the NBA's Most Improved Player Award in 1994-95 after averaging 9.7 points, 4.8 assists and 1.9 steals... Suns forward/center **Amar'e Stoudemire** would have attended the University of Memphis had he not declared early for the 2002 NBA Draft, where he was the ninth overall selection by Phoenix... Grizzlies guard **Mike Conley** had a career-high 11 assists along with 15 points in the Feb. 26 game with the Suns... Grizzlies Director of Basketball Media Relations **Dustin Krugel** spent seven seasons (2000-07) as the club's Basketball Communications Manager and Publishing Manager/Asst, and attended Arizona State University... Grizzlies Assistant Video Coordinator **Jason March** spent two seasons with the Suns (2005-07) in the same capacity.

	2008-09 SEASON Suns 109, Grizzlies 104 11/10/08 at US Airways Center PHOENIX, AZ – O.J. Mayo poured in 19 of his career-high 33 points in the fourth quarter, but the Grizzlies' late rally fell short as the club lost its ninth-straight meeting with the Phoenix Suns... It marked the second 30-plus point effort for Mayo (12-of-23 FG) in as many nights and the second-straight game he had set a new career high... Rudy Gay added 20 points, while Marc Gasol recorded 15... Memphis stormed back from a 17-point deficit (82-65) late-third quarter deficit to retake the lead 96-94 with 3:48 remaining in the fourth, but the Suns would close the game on a 13-6 run... Leandro Barbosa led Phoenix with 27 points (10-of-13 FG), including 16 in the final quarter and 10 of the Suns' final 16 points... Barbosa and Boris Diaw (13 points) led Suns reserves to a season-high 50 points... Amar'e Stoudemire registered 18 points (6-of-13 FG)... After scoring just 44 first-half points, the Suns exploded for a season-high 38 points in the third quarter, shooting 52.4 percent (11-of-21 FG) while holding the Grizzlies to just 34.9 percent (9-of-21 FG) in the period.

- The Grizzlies are searching for their third season series sweep of the season, having already swept the Golden State Warriors and the Washington Wizards... Last season, Memphis swept just two opponents... The Grizzlies have swept Orlando three times in franchise history, most recently in the 2005-06 season.
- Memphis has arguably the toughest remaining schedules in the NBA, playing the final **five** games of the season against teams with winning records (tied for the highest number in the league with the New Orleans Hornets).
- Since **Lionel Hollins** was hired as head coach on Jan. 25, five different Grizzlies (**O.J. Mayo, Rudy Gay, Marc Gasol, Hakim Warrick** and **Mike Conley**) have scored 30-plus points in a game, with all of those players besides Gay either setting or tying career highs in points... Before the Hollins hire, only Mayo had scored 30 or more points in a single game this season.
- The Grizzlies are one of just **three** NBA teams to have five or more players on their roster score 30-plus points in a game this season (New York – 6, Phoenix – 5).
- The Grizzlies are **7-18** since the All-Star Break (**7-19** in last **26** games).
- Memphis is **11-23** since **Lionel Hollins** took over as head coach of the team on Jan. 25 (11-42 before hiring Hollins).
- Memphis is **9-10** this season in games decided by five points or less (5-15 last season)... The Grizzlies are also **2-3** this season in games decided by three points or less... Last season, the club finished a league-worst 2-11 in games decided by that margin.
- Memphis is **2-25** this season when failing to reach 20 points in the first quarter (**20-30** when scoring 20 or more).
- On March 27, the Grizzlies defeated the Sacramento Kings 113-95, snapping a 20-game losing streak inside ARCO Arena that dated back to April 19, 1998.
- After completing a season series sweep over the Golden State Warriors (3-0) on March 30, the Grizzlies finished a sweep of the Washington Wizards the next game on April 1... Memphis had not swept either franchise since the 2005-06 season.
- Memphis finished a three-game Western Conference road trip (March 27-30) with a 2-1 record... It marks the first time the Grizzlies had a winning road swing of three-or-more games since Dec. 26-31, 2005 (3-1).
- The Grizzlies recently swept a back-to-back set with the Dallas Mavericks and Milwaukee Bucks, beating Dallas at home on April 3 and then winning at the Bradley Center on April 4... Before those two games, Memphis had not won both games of a back-to-back since March 21-22, 2008.
- **O.J. Mayo** scored 31 points and tied a career high with 13 field goals made (on 21 attempts) last night vs. Portland... Mayo has made a habit of pairing his 30-point games this season... The Rookie of the Year candidate has gone over 30 a total of **seven** times this season with the first six coming in three two-game sets.
- **Mike Conley** is averaging **14.5** points, **3.9** rebounds and **5.9** assists in **34** games since **Lionel Hollins** was named head coach on Jan. 25... Conley averaged 7.9 points, 2.9 rebounds and 3.0 assists in 43 games this season before Hollins' hiring.
- **Mike Conley** has had **three** 20/5/5 performances (pts/reb/ast) in his last **seven** games... The second-year guard had never posted a statline like that in his previous 123 career games.
- The Grizzlies are **5-2** this season when **Mike Conley** scores 20 or more points.
- Already one of the most versatile centers in the league, **Marc Gasol** is one of just six starting centers in the NBA (**Dwight Howard, Yao Ming, Shaquille O'Neal, Mehmet Okur, David Lee**) to have posted 800-plus points, 500-plus rebounds and 100-plus assists this season.
- **Marc Gasol** is shooting **.533** from the field, leading all NBA rookies, and is on pace to break his brother **Pau Gasol's** franchise rookie record (.518 in 2001-02)... Gasol has the highest field goal percentage for a qualifying rookie since **Andrew Bogut** (.533 in 2005-06).
- **Marc Gasol** is shooting **57.9** percent this season (**73-of-126** FG) in the fourth quarter and overtime this season.
- Memphis has used a three-rookie starting lineup (**O.J. Mayo, Marc Gasol** and **Darrell Arthur**) in **52** games this season.... Before this season, the Grizzlies had started a rookie trio in just four games total since moving from Vancouver to Memphis in 2001, with all four of those games coming in the 2001-02 season (**Pau Gasol, Shane Battier** and **Will Solomon**).
- Memphis has used its current starting lineup (Conley, Mayo, Gay, Arthur, Gasol) in **21**-straight games dating back to Feb. 25 at Indiana.
- **Marc Gasol** scored a career-high 30 points and guard **Mike Conley** added a career-high 31 in Memphis' 110-105 home loss to Philadelphia on March 7... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it's the first time in franchise history that the Grizzlies have gotten 30 points from both their starting center and from a starting guard. Only one other NBA center/guard combo has pulled this trick this season... Marc's brother **Pau Gasol** and **Kobe Bryant** have done it three times for the Lakers.
- **Mike Conley** (31 points, nine assists) and **Marc Gasol** (30 points, 13 rebounds) became the first Grizzlies duo since **Rudy Gay** and **Mike Miller** on Dec. 3, 2007 vs. Portland to each record 30-plus points in a game... Gasol also became just the seventh player in Memphis franchise history to post a 30-10 game, a list that includes his brother **Pau Gasol**.
- Seven of the 14 players on the Grizzlies' roster were 23 years old or younger at the start of the season.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW

Rookie sensation **O.J. Mayo** has made a strong case for winning the 2008-09 NBA Rookie of the Year Award... The 6-4, 210-pound guard leads all rookies in scoring (**18.4** points) and minutes (**38.0**) and places in the Top 5 in four other major statistical categories... As part of the USC product's Rookie of the Year campaign, the Memphis Grizzlies unveiled three different Mayo billboards in Phoenix during All-Star Weekend, where the explosive scorer participated in the Rookie Challenge as well as the GEICO H-O-R-S-E competition... In conjunction with the campaign, the Grizzlies have also launched voteoj.com, a Web site that includes Mayo's statistical accomplishments this season as well as testimonials from players, coaches and media members.

CONLEY IMPROVING

Second-year guard **Mike Conley** has picked up his overall game since **Lionel Hollins** took over as head coach... The 21-year-old exploded for a career-high 31 points and nine assists on March 7 vs. Philadelphia and posted at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists three times in four games from March 27-April 1 after having never posted a 20/5/5 statline in his previous 123 career games... During Memphis' four-game winning streak from March 30-April 4, Conley averaged 21.3 points... The second-year point guard posted double-doubles in consecutive games from Feb. 18-20 after doubling up just twice in his first 106 career games... Memphis is **5-2** this season when Conley scores 20-or-more points.

EVERYTHING GOES BETTER WITH MAYO

NO ORDINARY ROOKIE

O.J. Mayo had his string of 25 consecutive games in double figures to start his NBA career snapped on Dec. 19 vs. Charlotte, but the streak had been one of the longest the league has seen in recent years... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Mayo was one of just six players since the 1979-80 season to start his NBA career with 25-plus games of 10-plus points, ahead of NBA greats such as **Magic Johnson** and **Larry Bird**... It marked the NBA's longest career-starting streak since **David Robinson** started his career with 77-straight double-digit games for the San Antonio Spurs in the 1989-90 season... BACK TO THE FUTURE

Memphis' major infusion of young talent is reflected in this season's regular starting lineup, which includes rookies **O.J. Mayo**, **Marc Gasol** and **Darrell Arthur**... Memphis has started three rookies in a game 52 times this season... The Grizzlies sparingly started a rookie trio in the 2001-02 season, the club's first in Memphis, with **Pau Gasol** (79 starts), **Shane Battier** (78 starts) and **Will Solomon** (four starts)... After that trio's final start on April 6, 2002, the Grizzlies did not start three rookies in a game until Mayo, Arthur and Marc Gasol started in the 2008-09 home opener on Oct. 31 vs. Orlando... The team fought back from a 15-point deficit and earned the first home opener win in Memphis' eight-year history, on a buzzer-beating 18-footer by **Rudy Gay**... Here is a look at the 2008-09 Grizzlies matched with the last four NBA teams that regularly went with a three-rookie starting lineup:

With double-digit victories on Feb. 2 at Washington and on Feb. 4 vs. Houston, Memphis picked up consecutive double-digit wins for the first time since winning the final three games of the 2006-07 season (April 14-18, 2007) when current head coach **Lionel Hollins** was serving as an assistant for the team... THE FUTURE IS NOW

The Grizzlies boast one of the largest collections of young talent in the NBA, carrying **seven** players who were 23 years old or younger at the start of the season on the roster and four rookies (**O.J. Mayo**, **Darrell Arthur**, **Marc Gasol** and **Hamed Haddadi**)... In **45** games this season, Memphis started **Rudy Gay** (22 years old), **O.J. Mayo** (21), **Marc Gasol** (23**), **Darrell Arthur** (20) and **Mike Conley** (21), a starting unit with an average age at the start of the season of 21.4 years old... By comparison, the 2007-08 University of Memphis Tigers, who made it to the NCAA Championship Game last season, had a starting five whose average age was 21.6 years old! The Grizzlies allowed a franchise-record low 29.5 field goal percentage to the New Orleans Hornets on Feb. 9, one game after the team held the Toronto Raptors to a season-low 29.5 percent from the field... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Memphis is the first team in nearly 50 years to hold consecutive opponents under 30.0 percent shooting, the first since the St. Louis Hawks in 1959 held the Philadelphia Warriors (Dec. 19) and Detroit Pistons (Dec. 20) below that number... Prior to the last two games, the Grizzlies were allowing 48.1 percent shooting, which ranked 29th in the NBA.

YOUNG AND HUNGRY

Memphis is one of just **two** teams in the NBA with at least four rookies on its roster (**O.J. Mayo**, **Marc Gasol**, **Darrell Arthur** and **Hamed Haddadi**) along with the Portland Trail Blazers (**Greg Oden**, **Rudy Fernandez**, **Jerryd Bayless** and **Nicolas Batum**).

FOREIGN LEGION

The Grizzlies entered the 2008-09 season with three seven-foot centers on its roster, each from a different country outside of the United States... With **Darko Milicic** (7-0, Serbia), **Marc Gasol** (7-1, Spain) and **Hamed Haddadi** (7-2, Iran), it marks the first time in club history that the team has carried three seven-footers on the roster at the same time... On Feb. 18, the Grizzlies added **Chris Mihm**, giving the club four seven-footers... Haddadi himself is tied with **Jake Tsakalidis** (2003-06) and **Cezary Trybanski** (2002-03) as the tallest players in Grizzlies history.

For Memphis Grizzlies telecasts this season, Fox has transitioned to Fox Sports Tennessee as its channel identifier instead of FSN South... FS Tennessee, the exclusive local television rights holder to the Grizzlies, will televise 52 Grizzlies games with an additional 18 games scheduled to air on its sister network SportSouth during the 2008-09 season... In addition, 10 Grizzlies games will be broadcast in high-definition television to fans across the Mid-South for the 2008-09 NBA season.

Biography

On Jan. 25, 2009, Memphis Grizzlies General Manager and Basketball Operations **Chris Wallace** named **Lionel Hollins** the Grizzlies' 11th head coach in team history.

For Hollins, it marks his third head coaching stint with the Grizzlies, where he was a staple in the team's coaching ranks from 1995-07. The 20-year NBA coaching veteran has worked with current Grizzlies **Rudy Gay** and **Hakim Warrick** as an assistant under former Grizzlies Head Coaches **Mike Fratello** and **Tony Barone**. Hollins, who still maintains a residence in Bluff City with his family, recently spent the first half of the 2008-09 season as an assistant under **Scott Skiles** with the Milwaukee Bucks.

An original member of the franchise's inaugural 1995-96 season in Vancouver as the lead assistant, Hollins served as the club's head coach on an interim basis on two separate occasions. Hollins guided Vancouver to an 18-42 finish in 1999-00 (.300) after the team started the season 4-18 and again took the reins for four games in 2004-05 following the resignation of **Hubie Brown**. Hollins, 55, owns an all-time record of 18-46 (.281) as the Grizzlies' interim head coach.

Prior to joining the Grizzlies, the Arizona State graduate spent seven years with the Phoenix Suns (1988-95) as an assistant coach under **Cotton Fitzsimmons** and later **Paul Westphal**. During that time, Phoenix compiled an overall record of 394-180 (.686) and never won fewer than 53 games in a single season. The Suns won franchise-record 62 games in the 1992-93 season and represented the Western Conference in the 1993 NBA Finals against the Chicago Bulls.

The Arkansas City, Kansas native has served under three NBA Coaches of the Year, including Brown (1977, 2005), Fitzsimmons (1978, 1989) and Fratello (1986) and was on the coaching staff when Brown and Fitzsimmons were honored with the award a second time. In addition, as a 10-year NBA veteran (1975-85), Hollins was led by several notable head coaches, including **Lenny Wilkens**, **Jack Ramsay**, **Billy Cunningham**, **Bill Fitch**, **Chuck Daly** and **Paul Silas**.

Selected sixth overall in the first round of the 1975 NBA Draft by the Portland Trail Blazers, Hollins earned a spot on the 1976 All-Rookie First Team and won an NBA Championship as a starter for the Trail Blazers in 1977, where he was a teammate of current Grizzlies Assistant Coach **Johnny Davis**. A year later, he was an NBA All-Star while also being named to the NBA's All-Defensive First Team. Hollins averaged 11.6 points, 4.5 assists and 1.56 steals over 673 career games with Portland, Philadelphia 76ers, San Diego Clippers, Detroit Pistons and Houston Rockets.
